

This year's award was generously donated by Tony Harding from his Peoples Choice Win in the APS Mullins Contemporary Photographic Prize. The inaugural winner of this award was Andrew Green. Andrew showed a good eye for composition and a variety of images over the year which showed that he had a good knowledge of photography to build upon. Congratulations Andrew, you are a worthy recipient of the award.

The last award of the night was the <u>VAPS Meritorious Service Award</u>. It was a unanimous decision to nominate Mario for this Award, and as there were a few members, apart from the Committee, who knew about this nomination, I was really impressed that we managed to keep it a secret. Mario is a tireless contributor to the running of the Caulfield Photographic Society. His extraordinary time as Treasurer for a period of 10 years has seen the club become financially stable. His legacy as Treasurer and Membership coordinator is that the club now has a detailed and clear direction, and can be ensured of ongoing continuity. Additionally, he took on the role as lead presenter at our Beginners Course in 2016, fine tuning the course each year to keep up with new ideas.

His extraordinary commitment to the club has impressed every person who joins and there is not one person who feels that they cannot approach him for advice and direction. As our Interclub Coordinator, he ensures that as many members as possible get to be represented in exhibitions, as he feels that each member's work is important. He encourages those who are novices to participate in club competitions so they can improve their photography and shares his knowledge willingly.

His passion for Photography itself cannot be questioned as he strives to improve constantly, becoming a Judge about 5 years ago, completing his Masters, joining the Australian Association of Street Photographers to enhance his passion for this style of photography.
