The guest speaker was Arik Gorban, and his session covered Infrared Photography.

Arik's talk was really informative and easy to follow, not too technical. He covered topics including equipment required, best camera set up, camera conversion and Infrared camera lens filters options. He shared some of his editing tips using Photoshop. He also advised that the best time to take photographs is at noon on a sunny day! While this would be a 'no no' to most photographers, he explained it was necessary to achieve the best results. He did share some of his gallery with us, and his photos were truly stunning.
